Mr. H. Russel Robinson, the funeral helm of Dr. William Harvey, discoverer of the circulation of the blood. This helm is normally kept in the parish church at Hampstead and was brought to the Tower for Mr. Robinson's advice on the cleaning and restoration thereof.

Mr. Robinson, after examining the piece, made his recommendation and suggested that the craftsmen in the Tower were the best qualified people to earry out this work, with your permission. I have spoken to the vicar and the secretary of the P.C.C. and gave them Mr. Robinson's rough estimate of £5 that will be required to carry out this work. They will be grateful if you would give your permission for this work to be carried out and would like confirmation of any work you intend to put in hand in writing.

I understand that schurch armour is a subject in which you take special interest and we would appreciate any information you can give us concerning the history of the piece. The only information we have is that it was used for Dr. Harvey's funeral in 1657.

Since our meeting I have learned that the Master of the Armouries has ruled that all work on church armour shall be done free of charge for he feels that it is better that the armour receive attention rather than be neglected because a church lacks the necessary funds for the treatment as they so often do.


We propose to simply clean the helmet by removing rust and paint and then sealing the surface with a coat of strong acrylic lacquer. We shall also make good the rivet fastening the crest stalk on top of the helmet.
