PROCESSION TO THE TOWER

Choir, Clergy, Representatives of Harveian Society, Vicar, Wardens and the Bishop.

THE BISHOP STANDING BEFORE THE WEST DOOR SHALL SAY

"Open me the gates of righteousness that I may go in unto them and give thanks unto the Lord."

ANSWER BY THE WARDENS

"This is the gate of the Lord: the righteous shall enter into it."

THE DOOR SHALL BE OPENED WIDE AND THE BISHOP, STANDING WITHIN THE ENTRANCE, SHALL SAY:

"Peace be to this House from God our Heavenly Father, Peace be to this House from His Son who is our Peace, Peace be to this House from the Holy Ghost, the Comforter." THEN THE BISHOP SHALL ENTER THE CHURCH

THEN SHALL THE BISHOP DEDICATE THE TOWER

In the faith of Jesus Christ, we do hallow and set apart this Tower now re-built and restored, and do dedicate it to the glory of God and service of this Holy Church.

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, Amen.

Blessed by Thy Name, O Lord, that it hath pleased Thee to put into the hearts of Thy servants to re-build and restore this Tower for Thy honour and glory. Remember them, O Lord, for good and grant that all who shall enjoy the benefit of this pious work may show their thankfulness to Thee by making a right use of the same, through Jesus Christ Our Lord.

THE COMMEMORATIVE PLAQUE SHALL BE UNVEILED

Then shall the Bishop dedicate the Bells, receiving the ropes into his hands

Bless, sanctify and hallow these bells to Thy glory and service and grant that in our day and in the days to come they may continually call together Thy faithful people to the praise and worship of Thy Holy Name, through Jesus Christ Our Lord, *Amen*.

In the faith of Jesus Christ we do solemnly set apart these Bells now recast and re-hung in this Tower and do dedicate them to the glory of God and the service of His Holy Church.

In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, *Amen*.

THE BISHOP WILL THEN PLACE THE ROPES OF THE BELLS IN THE HANDS OF THE VICAR AND SAY:

"Receive again these Bells which we have solemnly set apart for hallowed uses as a sacred trust committed unto thee as the appointed minister of Christ in this Church and Parish and take care that they may be ever and only used in Gods service and for His Glory."

Now unto the King Eternal, Immortal, Invisible, the only wise God, be honour and glory for ever and ever, *Amen*.

Then shall the Bells ring a Short Peal while the Bishop and Clergy return to the Chancel

NUNC DIMITTIS

ORD, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace according to thy word.

For mine eyes have seen thy salvation,

Which thou hast prepared before the face of all people;

To be a light to lighten the Gentiles and to be the glory of thy people Israel. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost;

As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end.

THE TOWER OF THIS CHURCH FELL DOWN IN 1882. ITS RESTORATION WAS COMPLETED IN 1961 WITH A PEAL OF SIX BELLS IN PLACE OF FIVE.

THE COST WAS DEFRAYED BY THE WILLIAM HARVEY MEMORIAL FUND AND THE HARVEIAN SOCIETY OF LONDON UNDER THE DEVOTED LEADERSHIP OF ARTHUR DICKSON WRIGHT.
