The cost of the day to day up-keep has risen considerably during this period, coupled with the fact that the new extension has to be paid for. The 5th November is the next date. A firework party,bring your own fireworks, will be held on the Tuesday at 7.00pm on the Glebe. Succulent hot potatoes, hot sausages and coffee will be on sale to help combat the cold. Food for the bonfire should be delivered to the Glebe.

It is hoped to provide film shows on one or two Saturday afternoons a month during the winter. This is aimed at young children being cartoons and slapstick, where mum can park her offspring while she goes shopping and dad watches (or plays) football, racing etc. This does depend somewhat on the availability of suitable films, but a notice will be posted as soon as possible advising the date of the first showing.
