Continuing our programme of giving a facelift to the Village Hall, we have now ordered new curtains. To celebrate this, (and to pay for them!), the reorganised Social Committee have planned some activities which we hope will be of interest to all of you.

First on the list is the Maundy Thursday Coffee Morning, to be held in the Village Hall on Thursday March 27th., from 10-30a.m. to 12 noon.
